Guidelines for Abstract Preparation

The authors should adhere to the abstract format given below. Failure to follow these guidelines may result in the rejection of your abstract by the Editorial Board of the 2^{nd} TESL Undergraduate Research Symposium – 2023.

Abstracts should only be from original research. Concepts, Future Studies and Reviews are not accepted.

Formatting Guidelines:

Title of the Abstract: (Font: Times New Roman, 14, Bold, Centered). Title should be brief, descriptive, and should not span more than 2 lines. Capital letters should be used only for the first letter in the first word of the title, scientific names and proper nouns. Abbreviations should not be used.

Example:

Effectiveness of the Application of Multi-sensory Approach in Teaching Pronunciation to Dyslexic Learners: A Comparative Multiple Case Study on Three Elementary-aged ESL Learners in Gampaha District

Authors and Affiliations: (Font: Times New Roman, 12, Centered). The names and affiliations should appear below the title. The author's name should be written as first name, middle initial(s), and last name (see the example given below). Leave no space between the author's names and the affiliations.

Example:

Yanishi R. Pinto Department of English Language Teaching, University of Kelaniya, Sri Lanka

Body of the Abstract: A concise and factual abstract is required. An abstract is a single paragraph, without subheadings, indentation, or references. It should be an explicit summary of your presentation that states the research problem, the objectives, the methods used, and the major results and conclusions. Do not include bullets/lists or references in the abstract. The abstract should be between 250 and 300 words long and justified. The use of non-standard or uncommon abbreviations and references should be avoided. Keywords should be given leaving one-line space below this text. (Font: Times New Roman, 12, Justified).

Keywords: Three to five keywords or phrases in alphabetical order, separated by commas.

Include keywords one line below the abstract. Write the label "*Keywords:*" (in italics), indented 0.5 in. like a regular paragraph, followed by the keywords in lowercase (capitalize proper nouns), separated by commas. Second line (if needed) is not indented.

Example:

Keywords: Dyslexia, multi-sensory approach, pedagogic approaches, pronunciation

- References, tables, or figures should not be included in the abstract. Before submitting the abstract, make sure the guideline texts are removed from the template.
- Use either United States (US) English or United Kingdom (UK) English. However, both US and UK English should not be written in a single article.
- Non-English terms: All non-English terms should be *italicized* (*e.g.*, *et al.*, *viz.*, *in vivo*, *in vitro*, *ad libitum*, *de novo*, *Hambanthota*, *Yala*.
- **Software:** Microsoft Word (the template has been provided at the end of these guidelines.

Page setting format (Layout):

Paper size: A4 (210 x 297 mm) typed single-sided only

Font: Times New Roman

Font size: 12

Line spacing: 1.5 Text alignment: Justify Margins: 2.5 cm (1") on all sides Word count: Maximum of 300 words

Accepted abstracts will be published online in the Conference Proceedings -2^{nd} TESL Undergraduate Research Symposium -2023 as the online version after the presentations. In addition, the abstracts will be deposited in the university e-repository for wider exposure. The papers, not presented by the authors will be removed from the final version of the conference proceedings.

All submissions should be made electronically through the online abstract submission email, <u>teslresearchsymposium@gmail.com</u>. Abstracts that are not submitted through email will be rejected.

Template Title of your abstract, capitalize first letter - (Font: Times New Roman,14, Bold, Centered, Line Space 1.5)

Names of the Author - The author name should be written as first name, middle initial(s), and last name. (Font: Times New Roman, 12, centered)
Affiliations - Department, Faculty, University, Institute or School, Country (Font: Times New Roman, 12, centered)

Abstract

Body/Text of the abstract: 250-300 words, no subheadings (Font: Times New Roman, 12, Justified).
