Course Content:

To accomplish identified ILOs of the course unit is developed following interrelated learning activities:

- 1. An introduction to the nature of course unit, its ILOs, basic concepts, and historical background of community service engagements and volunteerism will be provided through a series of lecture hours (2 lecture hours x 8 weeks).
- 2. A series of guidance will be provided through LMS, mentoring, and supervision on preparation project work targeted community service engagement proposed by a group of students in each department who are following the degree program. Each

department will be nominated a lecturer who is responsible for mentoring and supervising the students' community service engagement proposal and proposed activities carried out. When there is no sufficient number of students under a particular department such small group of students can be joint with another department community service engagement planning works in terms of collaboration between each department.

- 3. Community service engagement activity which is a practical approach should be implement targeting a particular community, society, association, institution, or socially excluded group in the mainstream society and the group of students needs to produce audio visual evidences at the end of the activity performed. This is in addition to the project proposal and they can upload such evidences into the university website, their Face Book walls, etc. However, such public domains should be used after consultation of the mentor in the respective departments.
- 4. All respective students' groups who are engaging in community services are expected to have a healthy dialogues between group members and fellow students and teachers as well as other interested members or groups in different platforms, especially in online platforms.
